

SAN FRANCISCO RECREATION AND PARKS



**23K** number of pounds of food grown at Alemany Farm and given away

Urban agriculture supports food security



**2,800** hours of service learning provided by youth gardeners

**\$1.6M** invested to open the new Geneva Community Garden

Plus, \$420K for repairs & new programs at 20 sites

## Did you know?

Recreation and Parks supported increased public access to our community garden sites by providing **416 volunteer workday opportunities** and other events in the past year, where **5,500 community members** gave a total of **16,831 hours of service** to our gardens. Their contribution during these workdays are valued at **\$489,613**, which is almost double the annual Community Gardens Program budget. Through these events, the Community Gardens Program helped create connections between neighbors and garden members, leveraged activation and opened the gates to new audiences.
